Lately, I have been dabbling in QRP portable ops with limited success and made my first End Fed Half Wave (EFHW) with the help of fellow club member Glenn (W4BXR).

My wife gifted me a Soldering Iron set for my Birthday, so I figured it was time to build something on my own. I purchased an EFHW kit from YouTuber KM4ACK and built that by myself. It works well with my (tr)uSDX and, emboldened that build, I purchased a minimicrophone kit from K6ARK and successfully completed that to round out my QRP kit.

I activated my first POTA park at our 40th anniversary POTA picnic and did it QRP (Because I apparently do not like myself!).

Somewhere along the line I threw my hat in the ring to become the Public Information Officer for the club and after a long and hard campaign (running unopposed ^(c)) I was unanimously elected! LOL!


2024 Field Day




























Upcoming Event Calendar:
