Members of the club occupied a cabin in Cedars Of Lebanon State Park to participate in Winter Field Day 2025. Winter Field Day is an exciting annual event for amateur radio enthusiasts and It offers a unique opportunity for radio operators to set up field operations in remote locations, enabling them to connect with other participants worldwide. We ran a total of 4 stations at any one time in the Indoor category, with considerably more than four operators participating across the weekend. It was a great time to hang out and play radio as well as practice setting up your station in a new environment.

432 MHz Wednesday April 30, 2025. 2300z (7pm EDT) to 0600z (11pm PDT), operate no more than four hours between your first contact and your last contact.

Microwave (902 MHz and up) Saturday May 3, 2025. 0800 AM – 0200 PM Local 50 MHz Saturday May 10, 2025. 2300z through Sunday May 11, 2025, 0300z Full rules can be found here.
